

Scioto Water Inc. Campgrounds, Campsites, and Campers Policy

Campgrounds

In Ohio, a Campground is defined in the Ohio Revised Code Section 3729.01 as a Recreational Vehicle Park containing five (5) or more self-contained recreational vehicles; a Recreation Camp containing five (5) or more portable camping units; or a Combined Park-Camp containing five (5) or more of a combination of self-contained recreational vehicles and/or portable camping units. The State of Ohio requires a license for Campgrounds containing five (5) or more of these sites. Should Ohio Revised Code Section 3729.01's definitions of a Recreational Vehicle Park, Recreation Camp or Combined Park-Camp be subsequently amended, this policy shall be automatically amended such that it is consistent with the new definition(s) contained therein.

Any Member desiring to develop a campground within Scioto Water, Inc.'s (hereinafter SWI) service areas, shall first submit an application to Scioto Water, Inc. and provide an Engineering Estimate of the Peak gallons per minute required. Upon receipt of the engineering estimate, SWI will determine if the current infrastructure will support the additional water demand without interfering with the service to existing customers.

If the current infrastructure will not support the additional water demand of the project, SWI shall notify the Member proposing the development and advise the Member of the system improvements required to service the project, if any. Any improvements required to support the project will be at the sole expense to the Member developing of the campground, unless otherwise approved by the board.

If it is determined that the system will meet the increased demand, SWI will advise the developing Member of the size of water service tap and the type of Backflow Prevention Device that will be required. Upon payment of the tap fee, SWI will install a bulk tap for use by the campground. The cost to purchase and install the Backflow Prevention Device shall be paid by the developing Member.

After installation of the Backflow Prevention Device by the Member, Member shall hire a State of Ohio Certified Backflow Prevention Technician to inspect and test the Backflow Prevention Device to ensure it is working properly. Satisfactory testing must be completed prior to putting the campground in service. Per Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 3745-95, all Backflow Prevention Devices must also be tested routinely by a State of Ohio Certified Backflow Prevention Technician at the Member's expense, but in no event less than once annually. Annual reports shall be completed by no later than November 30 each calendar year. The Member shall share the test results with SWI, Inc. within seven (7) days of Member's receipt thereof. Failure to conduct testing or provide testing results to SWI as required by the deadline required may result in disconnection of water service, in the sole discretion of the General Manager, as well as any other available penalty, as determined in the sole discretion of the Board of Directors, in addition to those which may be assessed by governmental or regulatory agencies.

Failure to abide by this policy shall result in a written warning being issued to the Member. The Member shall have 10 business days to take remedial action to comply with this policy. Failure take remedial action to comply with this policy within 10 business days will result in a

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service fee of \$750.00. If a Member fails to comply with this policy for a period of 30 days after having received a notice of violation, SWI may, in its sole discretion remove the service from the corporation stop.

PLEASE NOTE: ServLine will not provide leak insurance to campers or campsites, and Scioto Water, Inc. will not provide any adjustment for campers on any campsite.

Campsites

Any Member desiring to develop and install on any tract, parcel or lot an area for four (4) or fewer Recreation Vehicles (RVs), Travel Trailers, or other comparable units, can do so without the need to apply for a license through the State of Ohio. However, they shall comply with all state, local or supplier laws, policies, procedures, rules and regulations.

In Ohio, all dwellings (whether a house, camper, tiny home or prefabricated structure used as a residence) must be connected to an approved sewage treatment system regardless of whether the dwelling is used as a primary, secondary, seasonal, or recreational residence. Compliance with this requirement is solely the responsibility of the property owner. The Member shall provide SWI with verification that the sewage treatment system complies with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations.

Any Member desiring to develop a campsite within Scioto Water, Inc.'s (hereinafter SWI) service areas, shall first submit an application to Scioto Water, Inc. SWI will determine if the current infrastructure will support the additional water demand without interfering with the service to existing customers.

If the current infrastructure will not support the additional water demand of the project, SWI shall notify the Member proposing the development and advise the Member of the system improvements required to service the project, if any. Any improvements required to support the project will be at the sole expense of the Member developing of the campsite, unless otherwise approved by the Board.

If it is determined that the system will meet the increased demand, SWI will advise the developing Member of the size of water service tap and the type of Backflow Prevention Device that will be required. Upon payment of the tap fee, SWI will install a tap for use by the Member. The cost to purchase and install the Backflow Prevention Device shall be paid by the developing Member.

After installation of the Backflow Prevention Device by the Member, Member shall hire a State of Ohio Certified Backflow Prevention Technician to inspect and test the Backflow Prevention Device to ensure it is working properly. Satisfactory testing must be completed prior to putting the campground in service. Per Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 3745-95, all Backflow Prevention Devices must also be tested routinely by a State of Ohio Certified Backflow Prevention Technician at the Member's expense, but in no event less than once annually. Annual reports shall be completed by no later than November 30 each calendar year. The Member shall share the test results with SWI, Inc. within seven (7) days of Member's receipt

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thereof. Failure to conduct testing or provide testing results to SWI as required by the deadline required may result in disconnection of water service, in the sole discretion of the General Manager, as well as any other available penalty, as determined in the sole discretion of the Board of Directors, in addition to those which may be assessed by governmental or regulatory agencies.

Failure to abide by this policy shall result in a written warning being issued to the Member. The Member shall have 10 business days to take remedial action to comply with this policy. Failure take remedial action to comply with this policy within 10 business days will result in a service fee of \$750.00. If a Member fails to comply with this policy for a period of 30 days after having received a notice of violation, SWI may, in its sole discretion remove the service from the corporation stop.

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Campers

When a Member installs a camper on any tract, parcel or lot an area within Scioto Water, Inc.'s (hereinafter SWI) service areas SWI will determine the size of the meter (or meters) that will be required. For single or dual (2) campsites, a new (or existing unused) residential water service tap of $\frac{3}{4}$ " will be required. For developments of 3 or 4 campsites, a new (or existing unused) residential water service tap of 1" or two - $\frac{3}{4}$ " water service taps will be required.

Once a water service tap has been installed or hooked up to any number of the campsites, the minimum bill will be charged plus any and all usage, for the entire time a campground, campsite or sites are part of the water system, regardless if any campsite is being used.

Regardless of the water service tap size or number selected, a Backflow Prevention Device as specified by Scioto Water, Inc. will be required on each and every service line to any campsite regardless of the type of unit being served.

If it is determined that the system will meet the increased demand, SWI will advise the developing Member of the size of water service tap and the type of Backflow Prevention Device that will be required. Upon payment of the tap fee, SWI will install a tap for use by the campground. The cost to purchase and install the Backflow Prevention Device shall be paid by the developing Member.

After installation of the Backflow Prevention Device by the Member, Member shall hire a State of Ohio Certified Backflow Prevention Technician to inspect and test the Backflow Prevention Device to ensure it is working properly. Satisfactory testing must be completed prior to putting the campground in service.
